### **Description:**

Attend this workshop to learn about local primary sources related to Women's Suffrage, President Grover Cleveland, and other important topics of the era such as WWI, the Erie Canal, victory gardens, and more. Part of the day will include a tour of the Matilda Joslyn Gage House with time to utilize primary sources there. This workshop will introduce attendees to NYS Archives resources on these topics and how to integrate them into student learning.

For teachers that need 15 consecutive CEUs, Part II will be held on May 11 at the William Seward House, Auburn NY. That workshop will be similar using primary sources on the topics of CNY and antislavery, abolitionists, the Civil War, William Seward and more. Those interested in the full seven and a half for the single workshop or fifteen hours for both, will be asked to submit to lesson plans or Inquiries; one centered on the topics of each workshop. All attendees will be encouraged to submit a lesson plan or Inquiry.
